

Badoit (pronounced "Ba-dwah") is named after Auguste Badoit, who began bottling the water of Saint Galmier, in France's Loire Valley, in 1838. The water was sold only in pharmacies until 1954. Badoit is a light, intensely sparkling naturally carbonated mineral water, with a rich mix of essential elements. The gourmet's natural mineral water, seen on tables of most restaurants in France as an ideal accompaniment to good food, Badoit is characterized by its abundance of tiny bubbles and its unique, delicate taste.
